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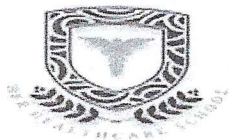
Definitions

- "Number of Students Who Began the Program" means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- "Students Available for Graduation" is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- "Number of On-time Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- "On-time Completion Rate" is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "150% Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- "150% Completion Rate" is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "Graduates Available for Employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- "Graduates Unavailable for Employment" means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- "Graduates Employed in the Field" means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- "Placement Rate Employed in the Field" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- "Number of Graduates Taking Exam" is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.



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- "First Available Exam Date" is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- "Passage Rate" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- "Number Who Passed First Available Exam" is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- "Salary" is as reported by graduate or graduate's employer.
- "No Salary Information Reported" is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.

Withdrawal and Refund Policy

The student has a right to cancel and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first of the class sessions, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. The institution requires notice of cancellation to be given in-person or by certified or registered mail to H&R Healthcare School, 6060 Manchester W. Ave., Suite 320, Los Angeles, Ca. 90045. The institution requires that notice of termination or cancellation be made by the purchaser if a student is under legal age. If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.

The withdrawal letter must define the last day of attendance which includes the student's last academically related activity. The student must also designate the date of official withdrawal.

[Copy and] The student shall be deemed to have withdrawn from the program of instruction when any of the following occurs: ment

1. The student notifies the institution of the student's withdrawal or of the date of the student's withdrawal, whichever is later.
2. The institution terminates the student's enrollment.
3. The student fails to attend classes for a three-day period. If a student received a loan for tuition, a refund will be made to the lender to reduce the student's loan debt. The refund computation will be based on the last date of student academic activity.

Within 10 days of the day on which the refund is made, the institution shall notify the student in writing of the date on which the refund was made, the amount of the refund, the method of calculating the refund, and the name and address of the entity to which the refund was made.

Calculation of Tuition Refund

The School will earn tuition on a pro-rata basis. Refunds will be calculated as follows:

1. Determine the total tuition for the program or course(s).
2. Divide this figure by the total number of hours in the program or course.
3. The quotient is the hourly charge for the program.
4. The amount owed by the student for the purpose of calculating a refund is derived by multiplying the total hours attended by the hourly charge for instruction plus the amount.
5. The refund shall be any amount excess of the figure derived in step #4 that was paid by the student.

Sample Calculation:

CNA Program = 25 days x 8 hour/day = 200 hours; CNA Program Cost = \$1400.00; CNA Program hourly cost = \$1400 cost/200 hours = \$7.00/hour
